Existential intelligence involves an individual's ability to use collective values and intuition to understand others and the world around them. People who excel in this intelligence typically are able to see the big picture.

Workshop on Competency Based Learning


Seminar on Competency Based Learning

Workshop on 'Foundational literacy skills' on 29 Sept 2023 – Conducted by Macmillan publication.

In the workshop tools & strategies for the effective implementation of Foundational literacy skills in the classroom was discussed. In this workshop it was guided that without burden in a play way the teaching learning must take place. Main focus was on sounds. It was told that teaching should be in a play way through activities.

LIVE 57 Progression of Phonics Instruction in the Foundation Years

Identifying Initial Phonemes	The children say the initial sound of the word while looking at the images.
Matching initial Phonemes	The children recognise two images with a similar Text sound.
Identifying Final Phonemes	While looking at the words provided, the children identify and says the last sound in the word.
Matching Final Phonemes	The children can hear two images with the similar ending sound.
Blending Phonemes	Children hear a series of individually said phonemes and then integrates them to produce a single word. (e.g. /b/ /a/ /d/ = bad)
Segmenting Phonemes	The children divides the words into distinct sounds, speaking each sound as they tap or count them. For example, a teacher could ask, "What are the sounds in the word 'bark'? /b/ /a/ /r/ /k/".
Letter Names, Letter Sounds	Uppercase and lowercase letters are named and their sounds are spoken to the children.
Short vowels (A E I O U)	The children read and construct words with vowel consonants and consonant vowel consonant patterns.
Blends	Groups more consonant letters in a word that make each sound heard (bl, br, cl, dr, fl, gr, pl, sl, sk, rk, ng).
Consonant Blending and Tracing	Pair of consonant letters that make the same speech sound (b, d, th, sh, wh, rr, ng).
Silence	When a word ends with a silent e, the previous vowel says its name.
Soft C/E controlled vowels	When a vowel is followed by a letter, the controls the vowel. They create a new word when they start together.
Advanced Consonant Sounds / Silent Consonants/Consonant Digraphs	Hard soft c and g: makes the /k/ (hard) sound when followed by a, u, or i; makes the /j/ (soft) sound when followed by e, o, or a. G makes the /d/ sound when followed by e, i, or o; it makes the /g/ sound when followed by u, a, or ə. Advanced consonant digraphs are words where two letters make one sound.
